Activity Synopsis

- Objective(s):**
- To identify Human Rights violations caused by Human Trafficking
 - To develop competences on designing effective programs on Human Rights Education for Youth Trafficking Prevention
 - To motivate and support participants in implementing joint projects and activities on Youth Trafficking Prevention
 - To discuss the 2007 – 2010 Strategy of Euro Mediterranean Network for Youth Trafficking Prevention and attract new partners
 - To introduce Human Rights Education and other instruments as a powerful tool for Youth Trafficking Prevention
 - To contribute to the element of Human Rights in the new 'All Different All Equal' Campaign

- Output/Results:**
- Motivation of participants to work on human rights education to prevent youth trafficking.
 - The creation of a network of organizations working on Minority issues within the Euromed region.
 - Greater understanding of participants of Human Trafficking. the causes

and the realities that exist.

- New contacts and friendships made, participants found people working on similar issues within different countries and organizations.
- New methods on using Human Rights Education as a tool for preventing youth trafficking were explored.
- Opportunities to be involved in the All Different - All Equal European Youth Campaign for Diversity, Human Rights and Participation were presented and discussed.
- The Euro-Mediterranean Network for Youth Trafficking Prevention was strengthened through new contacts and members.

Conclusions/Follow Up: There are 4 projects that have been planned by the participants throughout the course of study session. These 4 projects will be supported by the Euro-Mediterranean Network for Youth Trafficking Prevention and communication between Minorities of Europe, and the Directorate of Youth and Sport is necessary. A network has also been discussed involving different minority organizations in the Euro-med region and the European Youth Platform will be supporting this initiative.

Participants: 38 Participants (including 6 members of the preparatory team) took part in this activity. The participants were young people coming from 23 different countries (17 COE member states and 6 Mediterranean countries) and working on or having interest in developing human rights education as a tool for preventing youth trafficking.
