Comments:

- I think I was between active and passive as there were some language problems with me, but it was useful.

- Due to the difficulties I have with my English I did not participate as much as I wished.

- I feel I have been able to participate fully in the process and enjoyed – hope others too. I am not “youth” as such however I will be bale to transfer the knowledge I have learnt to at least 3 different organizations I am involved with.
- I was active, but in a negative manner.
- I do believe that in spite of being not so informed about the topic to be discussed before I was permanently involved in all the processes and activities during the session time. I had thought over many issues and have come to certain conclusions.
- It was my first visit to European country. That is why I could not be very active.
- I wanted also others to participate more to the study session issues.
- I did not have so much experience.
- If all the participants were so committed to actively participate in the discussions and to be able to give more insights from their own experiences, it could have been better for the whole study session. This is related even to some of the form or decided on the ongoing activities.

- I definitely learnt things and I hope I will develop my new knowledge and implement them in my work.
- I think so.
- I have got a lot of experiences during the study session and the work with groups.
- Yes, we can develop project in the field of study session with the appreciated help of funding possibilities.

- I thought that I will be highly informed about Compass from the presentation of Rui, but I could not. He did not well on the issue and the usage of Compass. The presentation of the guest speaker of NANE was very beneficial but it was very long. From time to time during the presentation I simply got lost. I think that the presentation should be more informative. It is better for us to be taught more than it used to be here in this study session. Comparing, we had more time to create new ideas or projects than being taught by our trainers. For me more training and less time to create new things. I felt that all of our trainers were very passionate and willing to teach or to inform us about the issue of trafficking prevention. Thank you for everything!
